1. Watch me read - Coming into school to read to your child from 2.30pm on Wednesday 6th March 2024

2. Come along to our bedtime story at 5pm on Thursday 7th March 2024

3. Sending your child's chosen book in with them on Monday 4th March, so we can read it to them and their friends

Access to books

1. We'll also be hosting a very special book swap. Drop off any unwanted books in the box outside the school office during the week, then come and browse! Please feel free to take something you would like to read.

Getting a free $\pounds 1/\pounds 1.50$ book for your child is easy – simply take your $\pounds 1/\pounds 1.50$ book token to your nearest bookseller and swap it for a World Book Day $\pounds 1/\pounds 1.50$ book OR use it to get $\pounds 1/\pounds 1.50$ off any ANY book or audiobook costing $\pounds 2.99/\pounds 3.99$ or more.
