Otherwise, he will have to be picked up from school by an adult, walk quite a distance home, and then walk back with the adult to pick up his sibling at 3.20 pm because he can't be left alone unsupervised at home.

Time with family


In our household, both parents are working till late so I don't have anyone to pick up my children at 1.45.

I am aware that you will offer wrap around care for parents who work, but I think it is unfair on children whose parents cannot collect them at 1.45 to see their peers getting to leave early when they cannot.
Children have missed out enough on school time
I don't feel I should pay for her extra care because I'm working as this is not my decision them to finish early, I feel that this is really unfair on the parents that have to work to make a living due to increase in costs and we should not have to pay for this
I think the children have had enough messing around of school education, and now with the reduced lunch breaks I don't feel this is the right decision
You need to find a better solution to this issue to improve the standard of teaching that does not impact their education nor financially by having to pay for wrap around care.
The last time this happened it was proven it didn't work, that's my understanding why it ended. As much as I would love this for our family and children, we can't just adjust our working hours to 1.45pm. Also working in a school myself, I can't just change my hours to suit a 1.45pm finish.
